

Addendum

Trees within the designated study area were originally described in four broad categories. They were trees 12" DBH¹ or larger, Significant trees that are 30" DBH or larger, Heritage trees and significant groves of trees irrespective of their size.

Further investigation has revealed there are no Heritage trees within the designated study area that are recognized by the Oregon Department of Forestry as included in their Heritage tree registry. The recognized Heritage trees carrying this state designation may be found at the following web link <http://www.oregontic.com/heritage/trees-brochure.php> .

Therefore, all references to Heritage trees located within the designated study area, and specifically the 46" DBH Oregon white oak referred to as tree number 181 on the attached spreadsheet addendum, are no longer valid. Although this tree is a significant tree (in excess of 30" DBH), it does not carry the designation of Heritage tree.

With this new information, there are now only three categories of trees surveyed within the designated study area. They are trees 12" DBH or larger (up to 30"), Significant trees that are 30" DBH or larger, and significant groves of trees irrespective of their size.
